There is a new Sherriff in town, New Council takes office, New Mayor elected



Mayor Gerson Molapisane with his daughters Vivian Mei and Matokane Molapisane during the swearing-in ceremony at Ivory Tusk Lodge on 22 November 2021.

On the 22nd of November 2021, a new council was sworn in at Ivory Tusk Lodge in Tzaneen. 67 of the 69 Councillors took the oath before Senior Magistrate David Shikwambana and Magistrate Rifumo Baloyi. Two candidates resigned before the swearing-in ceremony. In the November 2021 local government elections, the African National Congress won 51 seats, followed by the Economic Freedom Party with 9 seats, the Democratic Alliance with 5

seats, African Freedom Party with 1 seat, APC with 1 seat, the VFplus with 1 seat and an Independent Candidate with 1 seat to complete the 69 seat Council.

During the election Councillor Gerson Phetole Molapisane was elected as the new Mayor of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality. Councillor Sanie Tiba was elected as the Speaker of Council, and Councillor Given Malatji was elected as the Whip of Council (Chief Whip). Councillor Ngwako Maunatlala

was elected as the Chairperson of the Municipal Public Accounts Committee (MPAC).

Members of the Executive Committee were also elected with eight seats going to the ANC, 1 to the EFF, and another seat to the DA (see page 4).

Council also elected Councillors Maripe Mangena, Collen Stoltz, Judith Mashele, Sarah Baloyi, Willy Maake, Giyani Mkhabele, Conny Motwasethla, Betty Ramoshaba, Clement Ramathoka, Clifford Letsoalo, and Lebeus Ramalepe to serve the Council of the Mopani District Municipality.

Mayor Gerson Molapisane, Councillors Given Malatji, Thabo Maunatlala, Mfichana Shingange, Sophy Raganya. Constance Ramothwala and Maria Mmola were elected as GTM representatives to SALGA.


In his acceptance speech, Mayor Gerson Molapisane said "I Gerson Molapisane rise to accept the responsibility bestowed upon me by this council and the organization I hail from, the African National Congress"

The Mayor said that councillors and the administrators needed to work as a collective. "Alone I will not deliver for sure, my organization says together let us build South Africa, I say together let us build Greater Tzaneen Municipality". The Mayor also thanked previous mayors of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality for their contribution to the GTM. "We wish to unreservedly express a word of appreciation to our predecessors, our former mayors, Alderman OJ Mushwana (1996—2000 (TLC), 2000-2011), Councillor Dikeledi Mmetle(2011-2016), and Councillor Maripe Mangena(2016-2021), we really appreciate the good work that you have done".

The Mayor said that as leaders they are committed to working with all stakeholders. "We commit to walk and work with everyone in this journey, all stakeholders are as relevant today as they were yesterday," Said the Mayor

The Mayor also promised to work with the administration to ensure that the municipality does not regress on its "Unqualified Audit" opinion from the Auditor General.

In her acceptance speech after her election as the Speaker of the Council of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality, Councillor Sanie Tiba said "I promise to serve the people of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality with diligence, commitment, and honesty." The Speaker vowed to

intensify public engagement efforts and strengthen public participation processes by incorporating digital communications into our traditional methods to ensure optimal participation. Speaker Tiba also called for vibrant Council and robust engagements, she however stressed that such engagements must be "respectful and done within the parameters of Ubuntu, dignity, and professionalism".



On 04 February 2022, Mayor Gerson Molapisane was elected into the Provincial Executive Committee of SALGA Limpopo during the provincial conference held at the Ranch Hotel. Cllr. Julia Mathebe (1st DPC) Moss Maluleke (2nd DPC), Cllr. Thandi Zitha (3rd DPC). Mayor Molapisane chairs the Provincial Working Group on Community Development and Social Cohesion.

Councillor Gerson Phetole Molapisane
Mayor

Councillor Gerson Molapisane was elected as the Mayor of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality on 22 November 2021. He becomes the fourth democratically elected Mayor of Limpopo's second-biggest municipality since the formation of municipalities in the year 2000. In his Acceptance Speech at Ivory Tusk Lodge, the newly installed Mayor

promised three things, 1st is to do work, second is to do work and third is to do work.

PERSONAL LIFE

Molapisane was born on the 7th of February 1965 and grew up in Relela Village. He has two daughters and one grandchild. Mayor Molapisane is a member of the Lutheran Church. He spends his spare time reading or watching soccer if he is not doing his political work. He is a diehard Kaizer Chief supporter.

EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND

Mayor Molapisane matriculated in 1982 at Masalanabo High School. He holds a Secondary Teacher's Diploma from Setotolwane College of Education which he secured in 1986. In 1999 he obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Limpopo which was followed by Bachelor of Education Honours also from the University of Limpopo.

PROFESSIONAL CAREER

Councillor Molapisane spent 28 years as an educator. He began his career as an educator at Masopha High School in 1987. In 1990 he left Masopha to join Matokane High School where he served as an educator, Head of Department (HOD), Deputy Principal, and Principal. As an educator, his specialty subjects were History and English. In 2015 left Matokane High to join the Depart-

ment of Cooperative Governance Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs as Chief of Staff in the Office of the MEC. He served as Chief of Staff until 2016. In 2016 he became the Director for Research and Policy Coordination also at COGHSTA.

POLITICAL CAREER

Molapisane was elected and served as a Branch Chairperson of the ANC Desmond Mahasha branch for three consecutive terms from 2008-to 2013.

He also served three terms as the Chairperson of the South African Democratic Teachers Union (SADTU) Motupa Branch from 2011 to 2015.

From 2013 to 2014, he served as the Deputy Secretary of the ANC Markshope subregion in the Norman Mashabane Region.

In 2017 he was elected as the Regional Treasurer of ANC Norman Mashabane Region at the Conference held at Karibu Resort. He served as a Regional Treasurer from 2017 to 2021. Molapisane is currently the Deputy Chairperson of the ANC Norman Mashabane, a position he was elected to in September 2021.

On 04 February 2022, Mayor Molapisane was elected to the Provincial Executive Committee of SALGA Limpopo Province. Mayor Molapisane chairs the Provincial Working Group on Community Development and Social Cohesion

PERSONAL LIFE

Councillor Sanie Tiba was born on 6 June 1955

EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND

Councillor Tiba attended high school at Bokgaga High School and matriculated in 1973. After passing matric, Tiba enrolled for a Primary Education/Teacher Diploma at Tivumbeni College which she completed in 1979. Tiba later enrolled for a Secondary Education Diploma at Vista University.

She obtained her qualification in 1998. In the year 2000, Cllr Tiba obtained a Further Diploma in Education from Vista University. In 2011, she completed a Computer Literacy Diploma from Avuxeni Computer Academy. Her highest qualification is an Honours Degree in Education which she secured in 2011 from the North West University.

Cllr Tiba also boasts several certificates from various institutions. She has the Municipal Governance Certificate from LGSETA, Project Management, and Local Government Management.

Cllr Tiba was an educator from 1979 to 2015 at Ntwanano School.

POLITICAL CAREER

Councillor Tiba is serving her fourth term. Her first stint as a Councillor was from 2000-to 2006 when she served as a ward councillor and a member of the Executive Committee (EXCO). She served as a ward Councillor from 2006 - to 2011. From 2016 to 2021, She served as a PR Councillor and a member of EXCO.

LEADERSHIP ROLES

Cllr Tiba served as Chairperson of the ANCWL in 1991. From 1998 to 2000 she served as an additional member of the ANC North-East Region. From 1998 to 2010, Cllr Tiba served as an additional member of the ANCWL North-East Region/Mopani. From 2000 to 2006 she served as the Chairperson of the ANCWL Karel Makwala Branch and from 2007 to 2011 she served as Secretary of the ANCWL Edward Ramaila Branch. Cllr Tiba has been serving as ANCWL Mark Shope Sub-regional Secretary from 2014 to date.

Councillor Given Marvin Malatji was elected as the Whip of the Council of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality on 22 November 2021. The Whip of Council commonly known as Chief Whip is tasked with ensuring party discipline in Council among other responsibilities.

PERSONAL LIFE

Malatji was born on 13 July 1977 in Mariveni Village. Cllr Malatji is a resident of Mariveni village in ward 23.

He is married with three children. During his spare time, Cllr Malatji is either fishing or playing chess.

EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND

Councillor Malatji matriculated in 1996 at Shipungu High School. The Chief Whip graduated with a degree in Optometry (B-Optom) from the University of Limpopo in 2008. Councillor Malatji served as the Public Relations Officer (PRO) for the University of Limpopo Optometry Student Association (ULOSA).

PROFESSIONAL CAREER

He was employed by the Department of Health as an Optometrist for 3 years from 2011 to 2013 at Letaba Hospital. He also worked at Mnkwa Optometrists as an optometrist in 2009. From 2010 to 2011, Cllr Malatji ran his practices (optometry) in Malamulale and Soshanguve concurrently. From 2014 to 2016 Cllr. Malatji ran another optometry practice in Tzaneen.

POLITICAL CAREER

Cllr. Malatji has been actively involved in politics and community work since he joined the ANC in 1992.

He has represented the ANCYL Samson Mabuza branch as the secretary in 1996. He was the branch chairperson from 2009 to 2014 for the ANCYL Mcmillan Nyabane Branch.

In 2013 he also became the Sub-Regional Coordinator for the Markshope ANCYL until 2015.

Cllr. Malatji is currently the Branch Chairperson of the ANC McMillan Nyabane branch. Malatji served as the Branch Treasurer from 2015 to 2017 and Branch Secretary from 2017 to 2021.

In the 2016 local government elections, Councillor Malatji was elected as the Ward Councillor for Ward 23 of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality. Ward 23 covers Mariveni, Shipungu, Tshamahansi, Letsitele, and some farms. In 2019 he was appointed as the MMC for Infrastructure in Mopani District Municipality. He served both as a Ward Councillor and MMC until the 2021 local government elections in November.

Cllr. Malatji has also served as a member of the Community Development Forum under the Mavele Traditional Authority.

The Executive Committee of the Greater Tzaneen Municipality is made up of 10 members. The African National Congress has eight members with the Economic Freedom Fighters and the Democratic Alliance sharing the two remaining seats. EXCO is the principal committee of Council.

It considers reports from other committees of council before taking them to council with recommendations.

The Executive committee is empowered by the Municipal Structures Act to identify needs of the

municipality, review and evaluate them in terms of their priority. EXCO is also empowered to recommend to council strategies, programmes and services to address priority needs through the IDP and budget. EXCO monitors the management of the municipality's administration in accordance with the council policy directives.

Members of the Executive Committee are elected by Council. The Executive Committee is chaired by the Mayor and sits before any council meeting. EXCO has eight committees.





Ward Councillors

The Greater Tzaneen Municipality is made up of 35 wards with 125 villages and five towns. A majority of the wards are rural.

Ward 14, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23 and 31, are the urban although some parts of these wards are rural. During the local government election held in November 2021, the African National Congress won 32 of the 35 Wards, the DA won 2 and 1 ward went to an Independent candidate.

A majority of people in the GTM live in the rural areas. These rural communities fall under traditional authorities. These traditional authorities are led by a Senior Traditional Leader commonly known as Kgosi is Sepedi and Hosi in Tsonga. In the GTM there are eight traditional authorities which are Modjadji Royal Council, Maake (Bakgakga) Royal Council, Nkuna

(Muhlava) Royal Council, Mogoboya (Bathlabine) Royal Council, Xihoko (Mabunda) Royal Council, Nwamitwa (Valoyi) Royal Council, Sebela Royal Council and Mamabolo Royal Council.

A Community Survey conducted in 2016 puts the population of GTM at 416 488. GTM has 181 558 males or 47% and 208 536 females which is 53%.

Youth between the ages of 14-35 constitute 40% (156 9000) of the total population.

The municipality has five main towns with Tzaneen being the economic center. Nkowan-kowa and Lenyenye are townships a few kilometers apart. Haenertzburg and Letsitele are small towns which cater mostly for the farming communities.



The meeting dealt with issues of mutual interest between the farming community and the municipality. Piertter Voster, the Chairperson of the Agri-Letaba, and his colleagues raised several is-

They said that the offer was free of charge but work will only be done along electricity lines inside their properties. The Mayor was supported by Councillor Sophy Raganya (EXCO: Head of Planning and Economic Development), Benjamin Mathebula (Director Planning and Economic Development) and Freddy Rammallo (Manager Local Economic Development).

On 8 April 2022, the Mayor for Greater Tzaneen Municipality, Councillor Gerson Molapisane officially opened the newly rehabilitated Boundary and Billy Maritz streets in Tzaneen. Approximately 1.5 km of the surface of the Boundary Street and Billy Maritz street was rehabilitated. Mayor Molapisane said that as the leadership of the GTM they took pride in the quality of the work done on the two streets.

"We are proud of this project because it was done with our funds." said the Mayor. Most infrastructure projects are funded through the Municipal Infrastructure Grant (MIG).

The project planning, design, and supervision services were insourced saving thousands of rands in engineering consulting fees.

The project was completed in 3 months and cost the municipality R4.9 million. Molapisane complimented the work done by the contractor, Quality Plant hire/Expctera CC JV. "The quality work that you have done on this project will continue to speak for you in many years to come," said the Mayor

The project scope incorporated patchwork, base correction, installation of concrete V-drains, road markings, replacement of road signs, asphalt overlaying in Boundary street, and asphalt surfacing in Billy Maritz street.

Fourteen people were employed in the project comprising eight males and six females with one of the males being a person living with a disability.

Rakgoale said she will now have peace knowing that the family will sleep comfortably in their newly built house with a built-in kitchen, wardrobe, and new furniture.
