Contents:

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1. Purpose of the Document

The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) has appointed Engineerex (Pty) Ltd to undertake the development of the proposed Resource Management Plan (RMP) and associated Business Plan for Tzaneen Dam.

The **Background Information Document (BID)** aims to inform the Interested and Affected Parties (I&AP) and all other Authorities on what the project entails and the objectives of Resource Management Plan's (RMP's) process. Moreover, it invites contribution and participation from Authorities and I&AP's on the development of the proposed RMP. Furthermore it provides contact details for Engineerex (Pty) Ltd for future engagements in the RMP process.

2. What is a Resource Management Plan?

RMP is a plan which aims to manage the **utilization** of a **water resource** and the **surrounding environment** in ways which promote **community participation and beneficiation, environmental sustainability** and to **unlock socio-economic potential of the water resource for recreational use.**

3. Purpose of Resource Management Plan

The purpose of Resource Management Plan is to provide an Integrated Environmental Management Plan which include the Zoning Plan, Institutional Plan as well as the Business Plan so that the water resource and its surrounding environment can be managed and utilised in line with the principles of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No: 36 of 1998). The RMP will come up with plans that will provide guidance on how the dam can be used to benefit the surrounding community, preserve and conserves the beauty, biodiversity and diverse recreational opportunities in the area, while not negatively impacting on the primary function of the dam.

The resultant approved Tzaneen Dam RMP will be gazetted into a law. This will be used to manage what type of development is allowed within the dam basin, and which recreational activities are feasible on and the water resource. Sensitive and no-go areas will also be demarcated. The Tzaneen Dam RMP will be developed looking at the objectives underlying sustainable development.

4. The Need for the Resource Management Plan

There are a number of factors identified by DWS that have prompted the need to compile RMPs, which amongst others, include the following:

Resource Management:

- The water resource within a protected area, or subject to protection legislation.
- Invasive Alien Species.
- Water quality issues.

Recreational industry involvement:

- Conflict between users (in terms of Schedule 1) of the NWA due to no management tool in place.
- Public safety with regards to the use of inland vessels.
- Community and economic opportunities exists.
- Uncontrolled developments within the dam basin.

Community Participation and Beneficiation:

- Challenges of communities regarding physical access and access to the water-based economy of the resource.
- Participation and beneficiation of surrounding communities remains a challenge.
- Unlocking the economic potential of the dam through the establishment of effective Public Private Partnerships (PPPs).
- Equitable and sustainable benefit flow into the community through the creation of appropriate institutional arrangements.

Public Policy:

- The water resource should be identified as a local development objective in terms of an Integrated Development Plan (IDP) or Strategic Development Framework (SDF) for the relevant local and/or district municipalities. The zoning plan for the water resource must either be developed or updated.

Additional site specific triggers that were identified by Engineerex (Pty) Ltd during Ground Truthing amongst others include:

- The challenges of dam and community safety e.g. littering and drowning incidents.
- To regulate the development capacity within the dam basin, to involve surrounding communities in the recreation industry as well as to unlock the economic potential of the Tzaneen Dam.
- To develop and improve the participation and beneficiation of surrounding communities.
- To establish an effective and efficient institutional structure to manage the dam and its basin.
- Integration of the Tzaneen dam in other planning initiatives and decision support tools such as the Integrated Development Plan (IDP), Environmental Management Framework (EMF), Strategic Development Plan (SDP), etc.

5. Resource Management Plan Procedure

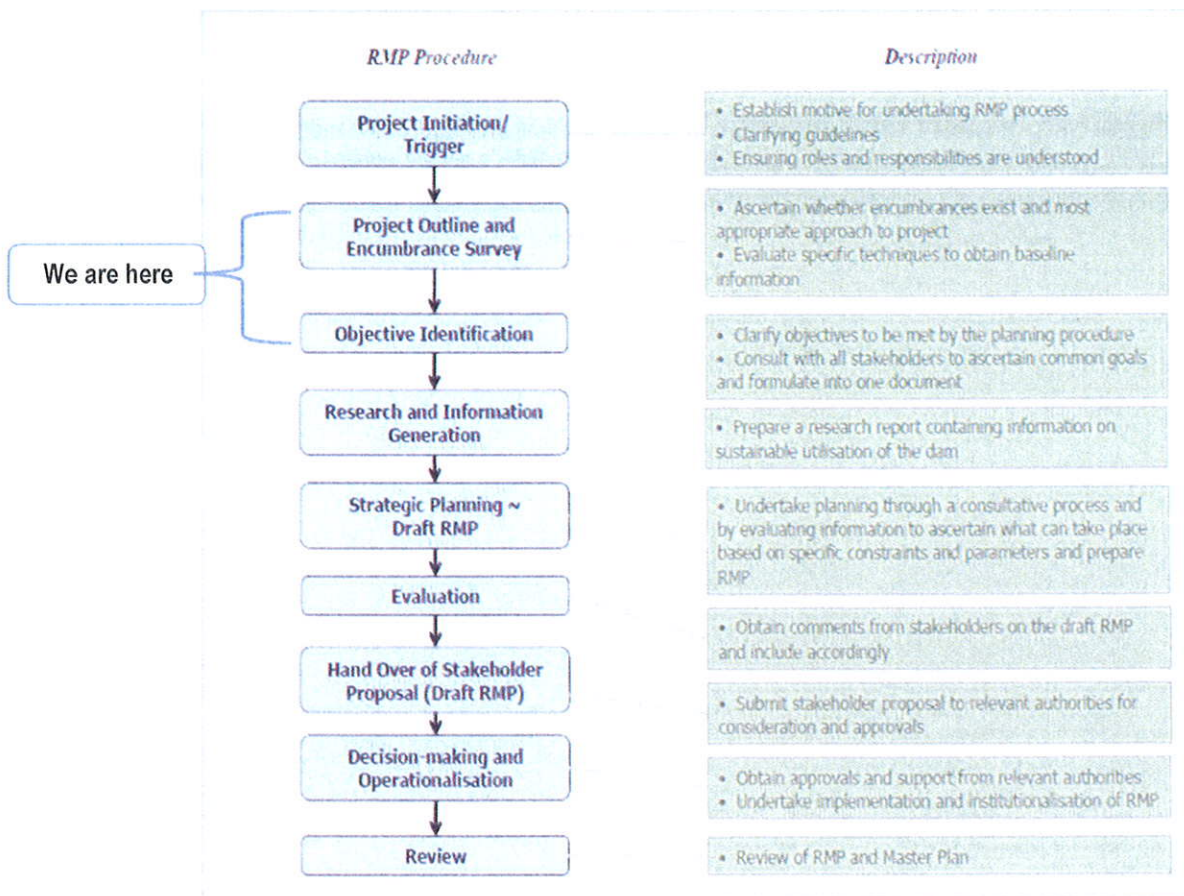


Figure 1: RMP Procedure/Stages

The RMP process consists of seven (7) phases as illustrated in *Figure 1*:

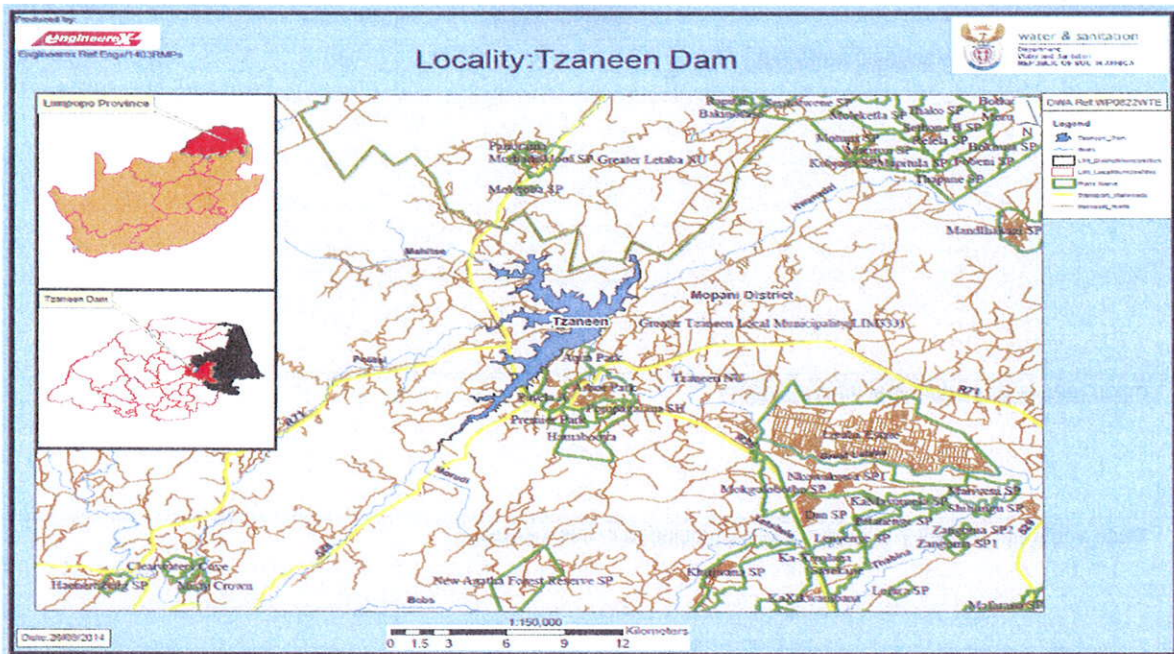


Figure 2. Locality Map for Tzaneen Dam

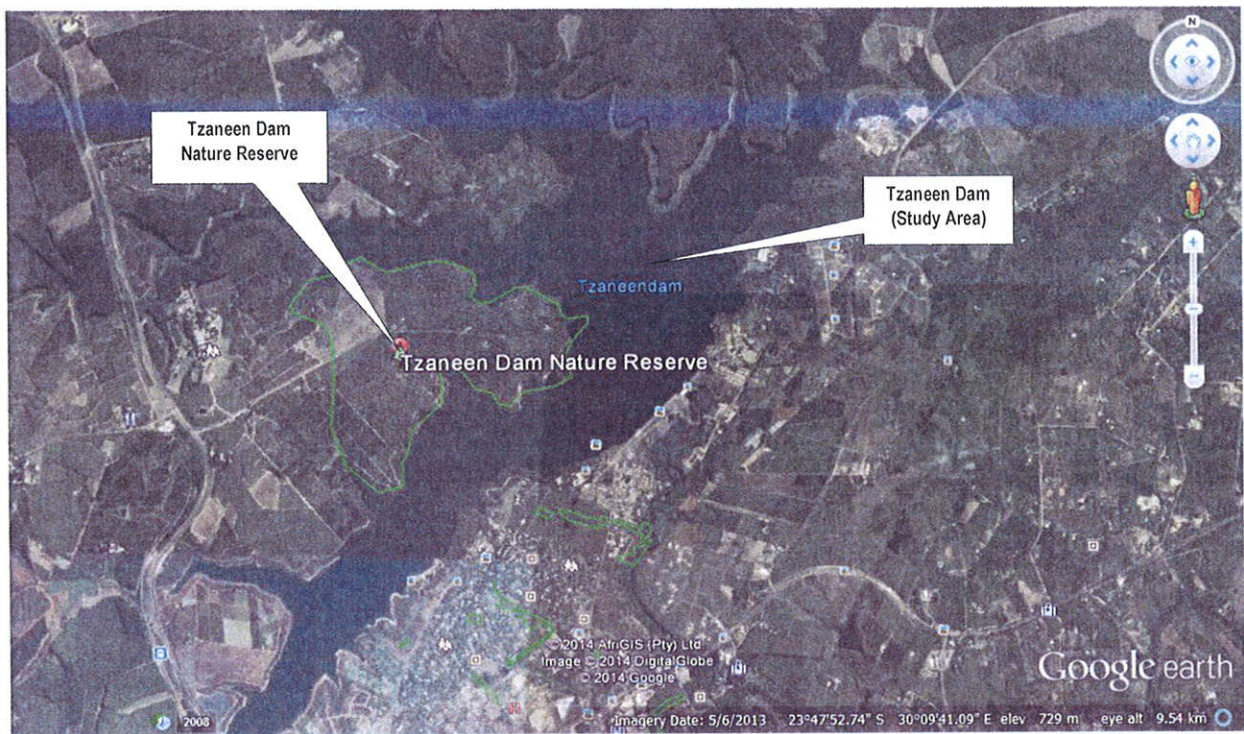


Figure 3 Google Earth Map for Tzaneen Dam

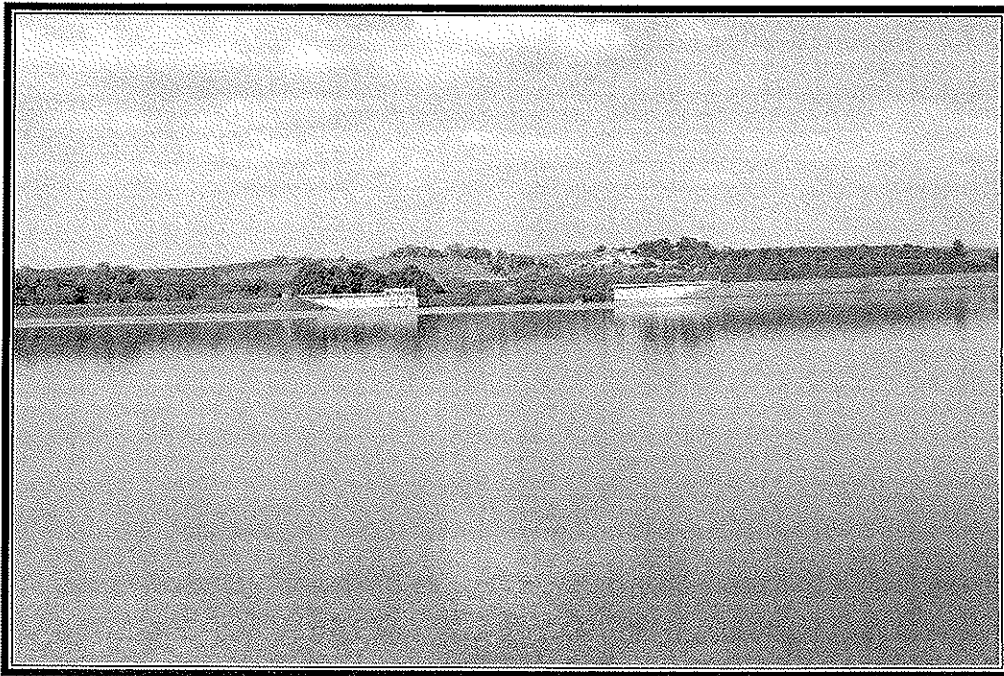

Tzaneen Dam is situated within ward 14 of the municipal wards. The Tzaneen Dam Nature Reserve adjoins the right bank of the Dam (See locality maps attached in **Appendix A: Figure 2 Topographic Map & Figure 3: Google Earth Map**). Tzaneen Dam impounds the Groot Letaba River. There are different activities which are taking place in and around the Dam and these activities include fishing, jet skiing, skating, boating, picnics, caravan park and bird watching.

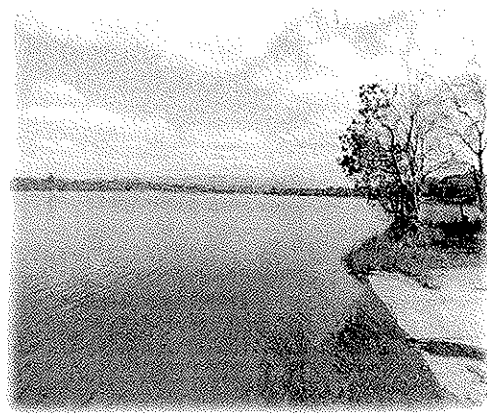


Photo 2: Boat slipway

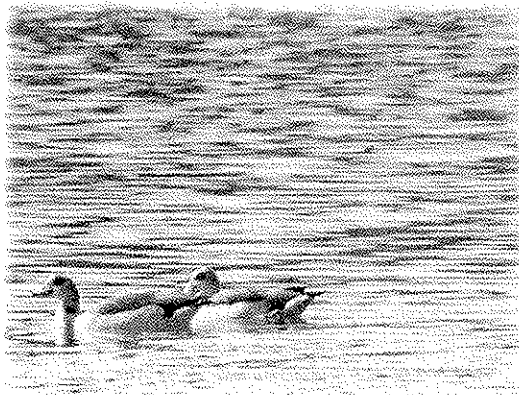


Photo 3: Fauna species

2. Purpose of the Resource Management Plan (RMP) and Project Overview.

A number of factors have been identified by the Department of Water Affairs which drove the need to compile the RMPs. Such factors include:

- The challenges of dam safety and community safety.
- To regulate the development capacity within the dam basin, to involve local communities in the recreation industry as well as to unlock the economic potential of the Tzaneen Dam.
- To develop and improve the participation and beneficiation of surrounding communities.
- To integrate Tzaneen dam in the Local Municipal and Development Plans and policies such as Integrated Development Plan (IDP), Environmental Management Framework (EMF), Strategic Development Plan (SDP), etc.
- To review the current institutional management which is managing the recreational water use.

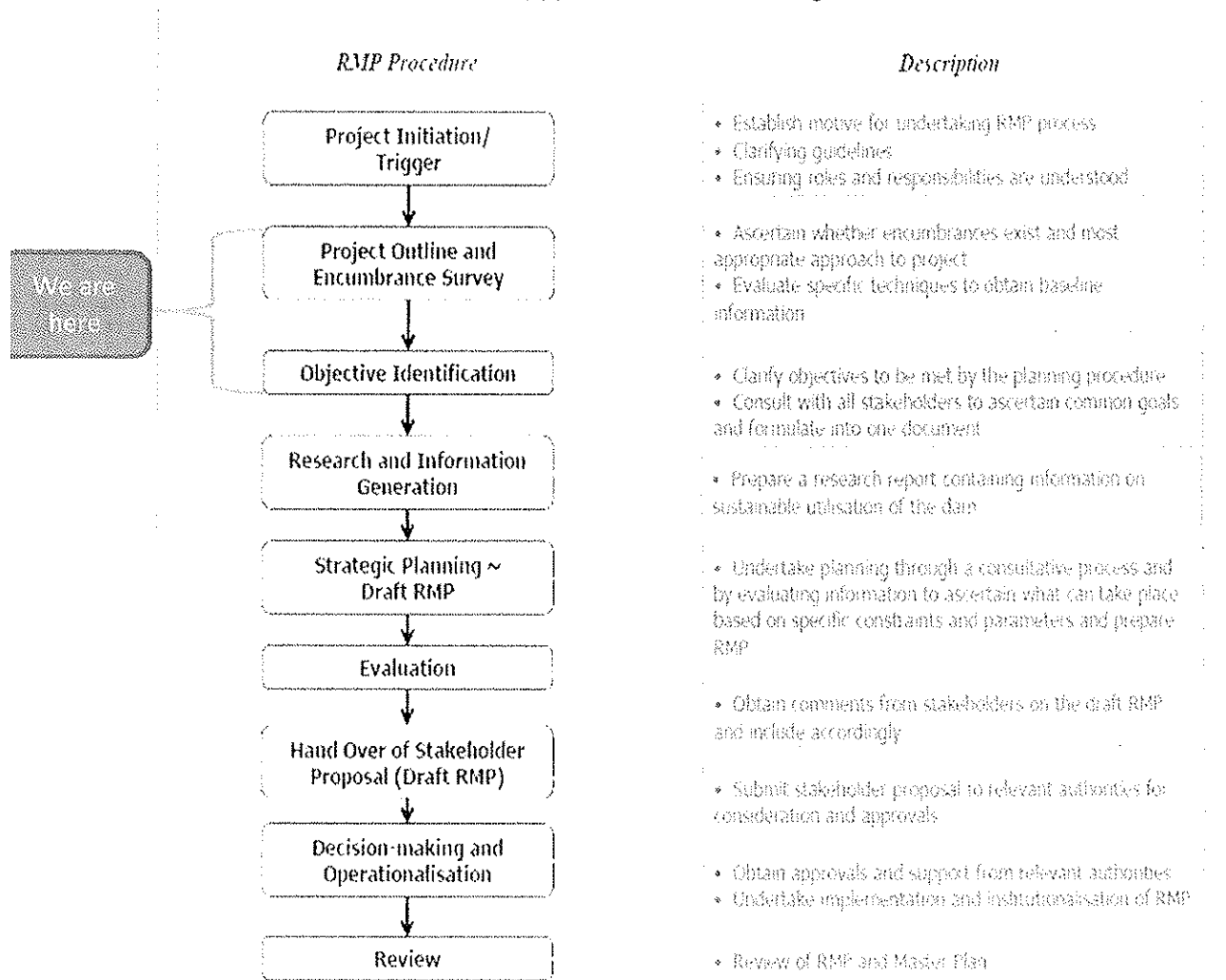


Figure 1: RMP Procedure/Stages

The RMP process consists of seven (7) phases as illustrated in Figure 1.

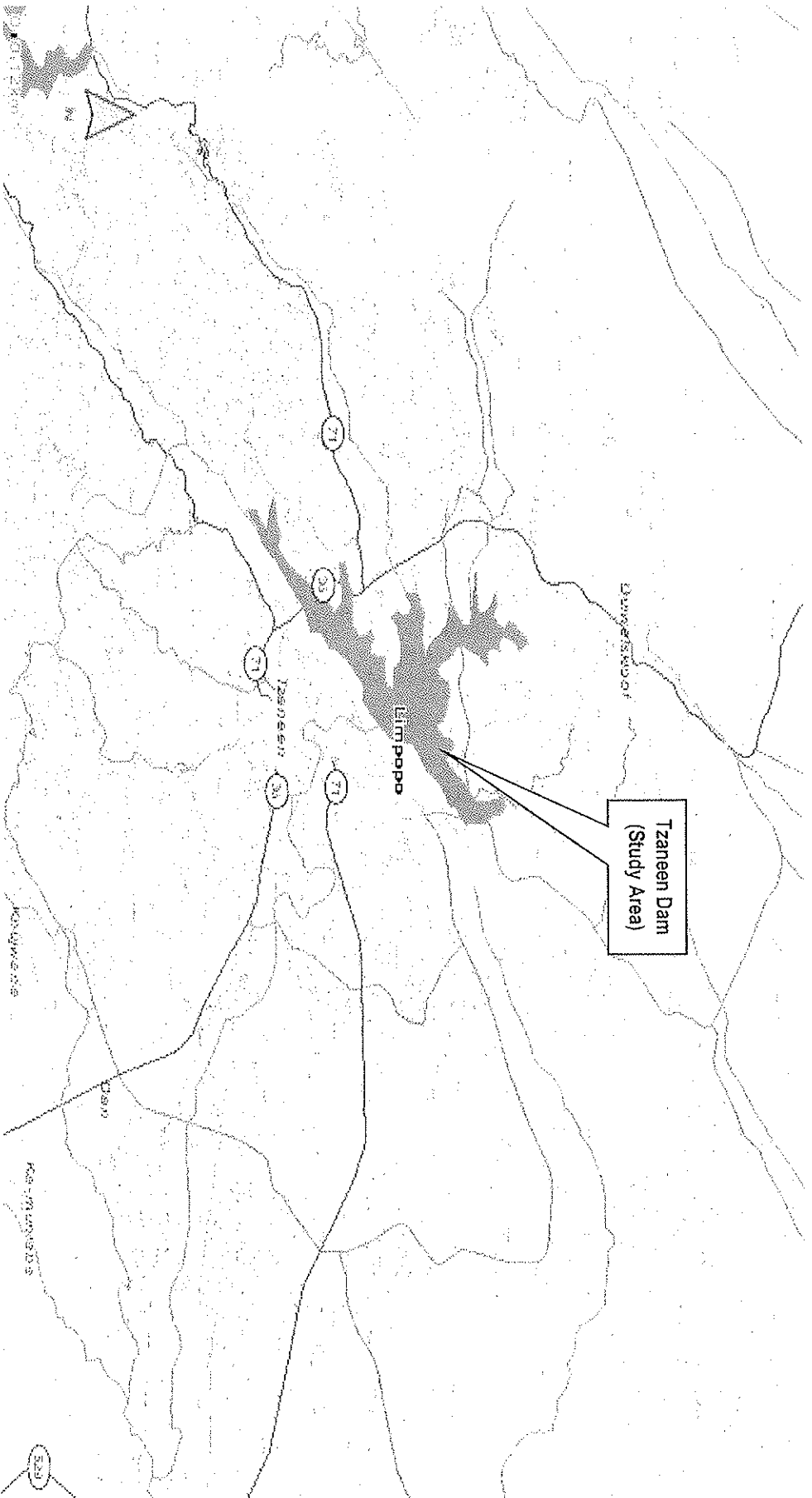


Figure 2: AGIS atlas viewer 2013

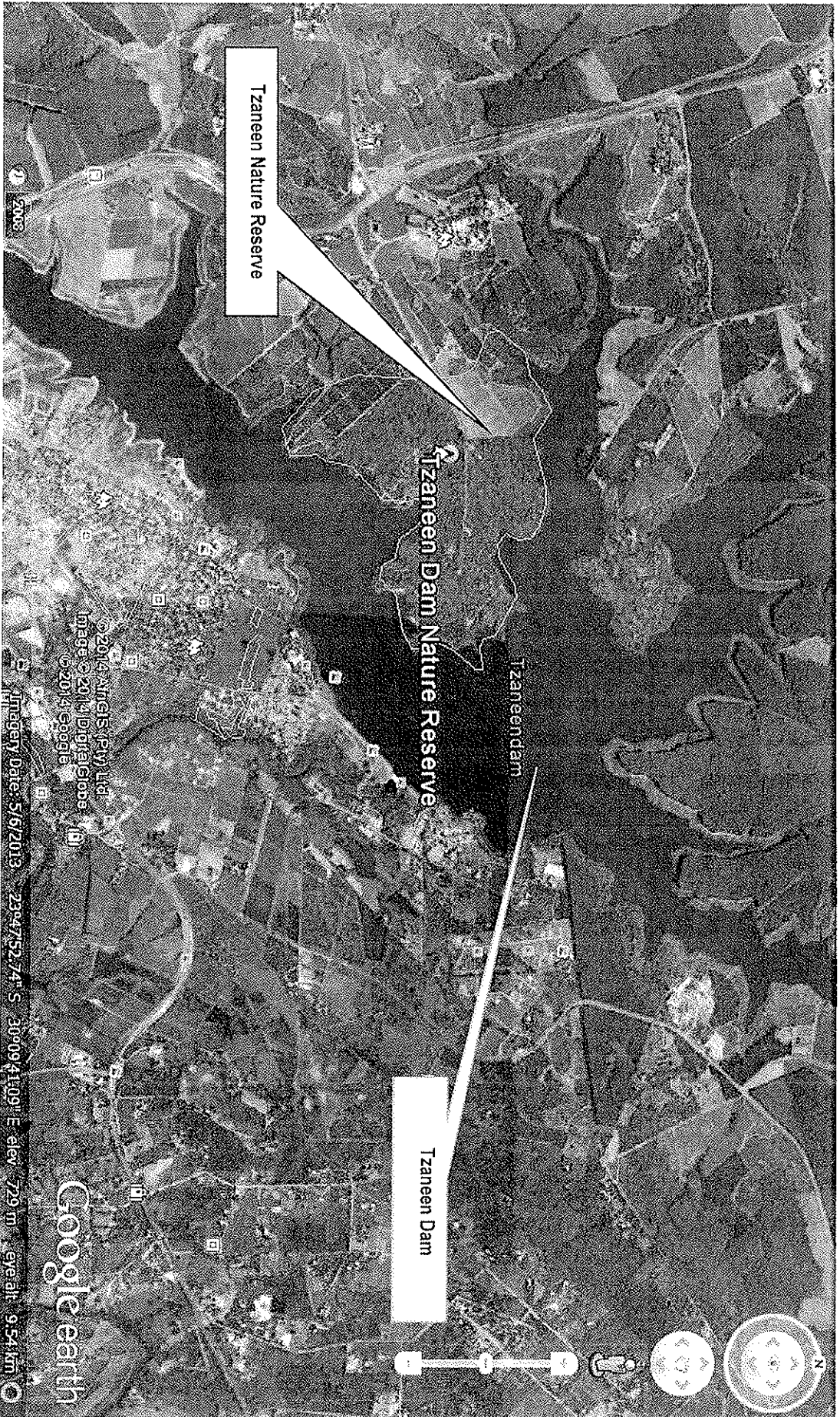


Figure 3: Google Earth Aerial Map



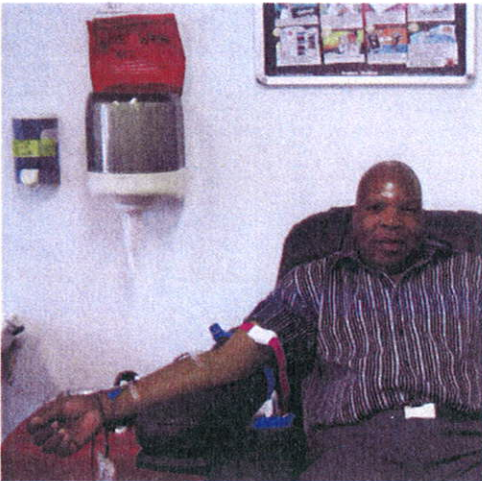

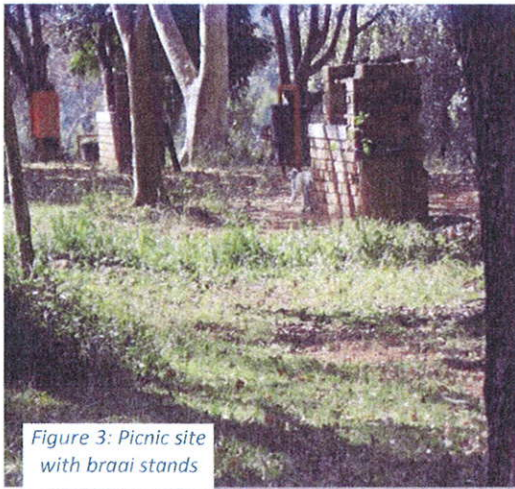


Figure 3: Picnic site with braai stands

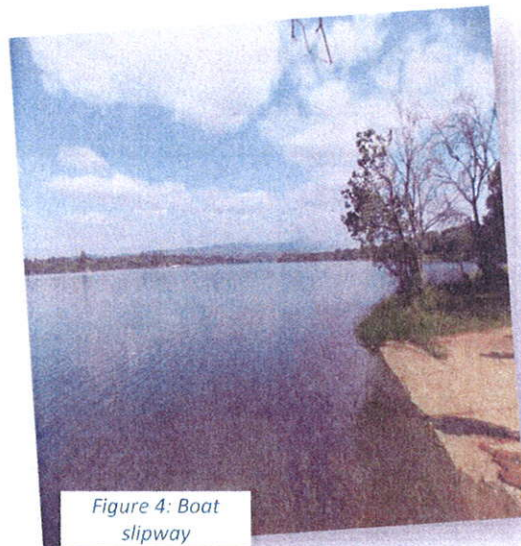


Figure 4: Boat slipway

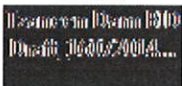







