WHEREBY IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:


1. INTRODUCTION

- The Employer has entered into a contract of employment with the Employee in terms of section 57(1) (a) of the LoC Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000 ("the Systems Act"). The Employer and the Employee are hereinafter referred to as "the Parties" 7:
- Section 57(1) (b) of the Systems Act, read with the Contract of Employment concluded between the parties, requires the parties to conclude an annual performance agreement. 12
- The parties wish to ensure that they are clear about the goals to be achieved, and secure the commitment of the Employee to a set of outcomes and outputs that will secure local government policy goals. <u>..</u>
- The parties wish to ensure that there is compliance with Sections 57(4A), 57(4B) and 57(5) of the Systems Act. 4.

2. PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to -

- Specify objectives and targets defined and agreed with the employee and to communicate to the employee the employer's expectations of the employee's performance and accountabilities in alignment with the Integrated Development Plan, Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP), the Departmental Business Plan and the Budget of the Municipality. 2.2
- Specify accountabilities as set out in a performance plan, which forms an annexure to the performance agreement. 23
- Monitor and measure performance against set targeted outputs.
- use the performance agreement as the basis for assessing whether the employee has met the performance expectations applicable to his job. 2.5
- In the event of outstanding performance, to appropriately reward the employee. 2.6
- Give effect to the employer's commitment to a performance-orientated relationship with its employee in attaining equitable and improved service delivery 2.7



- KPA's covering the main areas of work will account for 80% and CCR's will account for 20% of the final assessment. 5.5.3
- The Employee's assessment will be based on his performance in terms of the outputs / outcomes (performance indicators) identified as per attached Performance Plan (Annexure A), which are linked to the KPA's, and will constitute 80% of Coverall assessment result as per the weightings agreed to between the Employer and Employee: 5.6
